BURY THE LINES

TALKING POINTS

The Collin County Association of REALTORS® tapped into the Texas Association of REALTORS® Issues Mobilization Program to protect property values in Frisco.

In the fall of 2013,
Brazos Electric Power
Cooperative announced
its plan to erect 120-feettall electric transmission lines along two
high-traffic roads near
residential neighborhoods
in Frisco.

The Collin County
Association of
REALTORS* joined with
other stakeholders to fight
the co-op's proposal, seeking to have the lines buried
underground instead.

After more than two years of grassroots efforts and negotiations with Frisco residents, city officials, legislators, co-op staff, and state regulators, the parties reached a solution.

The lines will be buried in coordination with the city of Frisco's existing plans to widen the roads and install additional water infrastructure.

The Public Utility Commission approved the order to bury the lines on June 9, 2016.
