



Investments

Corporate VERSUS Non-Corporate

Covers administrative and fundraising costs.

These investments may only be used to pay for the administrative costs associated with running TREPAC's operations, which include education and fundraising activities.

Non-corporate funds cannot be used for federal or state candidates.

Funds are to be used by local associations only in local races.

Corporate

TREPAC investments are given to local associations from a member's incorporated business account.



Obtains allocated corporate funds with approval of expenditures by TREPAC.



With proof of expense for fundraising efforts.



Must complete a reimbursement form within 3-5 days.

(Local associations with their own political action committees will receive total percentages allotted automatically on a monthly basis.)

Non-Corporate

Allocations are to be given to local office candidates only.



As approved by at least a majority vote of the board of directors of the local association.



Request funds by completing the required forms.



If the local association has established its own PAC, the non-corporate allocation may be given directly to that PAC.



Fund Allocation

Corporate and Non-Corporate Funds—A portion of money raised is reserved for each local association to use locally at its discretion. The remainder is allocated to TREPAC and RPAC.



20% of each dollar raised from corporate and non-corporate funds is reserved for the local association to use for either fundraising expenses or local and county races.


After

LOCAL

60% of each dollar raised from corporate and non-corporate funds is reserved for the local association to use for either fundraising expenses or local and county races.



STATE/NATIONAL
80%
is used for TREPAC and RPAC.
Of this amount, 30% of each dollar is sent to RPAC until Texas meets its RPAC goal.



STATE/NATIONAL
40%
is used for TREPAC and RPAC.
Of this amount, 30% of each dollar is sent to RPAC until Texas meets its RPAC goal.
